


THUMB LATCH



INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Determine if your gate swings inward or outward and follow the appropriate images (Fig. 1 or 2).
- 2. Locate the latch in a desired location on the inside of the gate, making sure the latch bolt will align with the strike.
- 3. Mark the screw holes and thumb lever.
- 4. Drill 1/8" pilot holes for latch screws.
- 5. Drill two 1/2" holes for the thumb lever and chisel remaining material to create a slot for the thumb lever (Fig. 4).
- 6. Install and tighten latch.
- 7. Locate the handle on the front of the gate, ensure the thumb lever passes through the gate and rests under the latch bolt (Fig. 1 or 2). Check for proper movement of the thumb lever in the slot.



INSTRUCTIONS CONT'D

- 8. Press down on the handle thumb latch, it should move the latch bolt upward and lift the latch bolt out of the strike plate to open the gate.
- 9. Mark screw holes on the handle.
- 10. Drill 3/32" pilot holes for handle screws.
- 11. Install handle and thumb latch.
- 12. Locate the strike plate (Fig. 1 or 2) and mark the two screw holes.

NOTE: For outswing applications, drill two 3/8" holes at least 1-1/4" deep into the post for the latch bolt and chisel remaining material to allow the latch bolt to slide into the post when locked (Fig. 3).



- 13. Drill 1/8" pilot holes for the strike plate screws.
- 14. Install and tighten strike plate.
